


Many older adults experience concerns about falling and restrict their activities. A Matter of Balance is an award-winning program designed to manage falls and increase activity levels.

This program is FREE and for individuals who are 60 or older.






\*Notary - FREE

Main Entrance: Please follow the arrows to our temporary main entrance by the large glass windows (south side of the building) closest to Kennedy Road. The Food Pantry: will be temporarily located inside the building. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

### What is the end result of the project?

A new parking lot with a drainage system to solve water issues during rainstorms, ADA-compliant north-side entrances, and an accessible book drop. These improvements make the building more welcoming and inclusive for everyone!
